Kids Who Care Musical Theatre Announces 2010 Season

Season Includes Originals, Classics and Broadway Hit at Fort Worth's Scott Theatre

FORT WORTH, TX – April 7, 2010 – Kids Who Care, a non-profit international musical theatre company based in Fort Worth, announces its schedule for the 2010 season at the Scott Theatre. The new season kicks off with a one-night performance on May 7, 2010 at the Scott Theatre and includes original productions, classics and a Broadway hit. Tickets for each show, with advanced seat selection, are now available through Kids Who Care's online box office.

The season begins with Kids Who Care's original musical *District XI - Believe in Me!*. *District XI-Believe in Me!* was inspired by the popular YouTube video of 10-year-old Dalton Sherman's convocation speech to 20,000+ Dallas ISD teachers and staff, imploring them to believe in themselves and their students. Set in the halls and classrooms of elementary, middle and high schools, *District XI - Believe in Me!*, is a fun, timeless look at school. It also celebrates the teachers who are changing the world and shines a light on our schools, reminding us that, together, we can build the education system our children need. Performance times are as follows: May 7 at 10:00 a.m., 11:15 a.m., 12:45 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.

In June, Kids Who Care will perform the Broadway hit, *Seussical the Musical*. *Seussical the Musical* is based on the beloved books of Dr. Seuss. The story centers around Horton the Elephant, who finds himself faced with a double challenge -- not only must he protect his tiny friend JoJo (and all the invisible Whos) from a world of naysayers and dangers, but he must guard an abandoned egg, left to his care by the irresponsible Mayzie La Bird. Ultimately, the powers of friendship, loyalty, family and community are challenged and emerge triumphant. It's a story to make all generations laugh and cry. Performance times are as follows: June 25 at 7:30 p.m., June 26 at 2:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m., June 27 at 2:00 p.m.

Kids Who Care will debut *In the Zone* in July, 2010. *In the Zone*, Kids Who Care's newest original musical, catapults audiences to that moment when it all comes together -- when the courage to step up and try is met by the steel guts it takes to make it happen. *In the Zone* is for anyone, anywhere, who has dared to pursue their dreams. Performance times are as follows: July 29 at 7:30 p.m., July 30 at 10:00 a.m. and 7:30 p.m., July 31 at 2:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m., August 1 at 2:00 p.m.

In October, Kids Who Care will revive *District XI - Believe in Me!*. October performance times are as follows: October 7 at 10:00 a.m., 11:15 a.m. and 12:45 p.m.; October 8 at 10:00 a.m., 12:45 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.

The classic *A Christmas Carol*, which has become a Kids Who Care tradition, will round out the season. Opening December 17, 2010, this family favorite is the musical version of the Charles Dickens classic. An inspiring tale of hope and redemption, *A Christmas Carol* tells the story of Ebenezer Scrooge and his magical journey from a bah-humbug miser to a loving and generous man. Performances times are as follows: December 17 at 10:00 a.m. and 7:30 p.m.; December 18 at 2:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.; December 19 at 2:00 p.m.; December 21 at 2:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.; December 22 at 2:00 p.m.

All performances will be at the Scott Theatre, located at 1300 Gendy Street in Fort Worth. Ticket prices are \$18 for ages 16 and up, \$15 for those 15 and younger and \$10 each for groups of 10 or more.
