Special One-Night Performance Closes Kids Who Care Resident Company’s 2007-2008 Season

FORT WORTH, TX – April 9, 2008 – Kids Who Care, a non-profit international musical theatre company based in Fort Worth, will celebrate the close of its 2007-2008 Resident Company season with a special one-night family concert that includes selections from Kids Who Care’s original musical *Earth and Soul: A Musical Revolution*, followed by a concert with three-time Grammy Nominees Trout Fishing in America (www.troutmusic.com). The back-to-back performances will be held at the Scott Theatre in Fort Worth, Texas on Friday, May 2, 2008 at 7:30 p.m.

Earth and Soul: A Musical Revolution is an original musical about taking care of each other and taking care of our planet. In this fun, inspiring musical, five children are led to the center of the earth, where they encounter inner-earth dwellers – Music Makers, Mole People and Warriors – who warn of dangers to our environment, dream of sunlight and butterflies and challenge the five kids to step forward as leaders to save the planet.

“With original songs that include ‘Universal Mind,’ ‘Permaculture,’ ‘Dear Earth’ and ‘Look at Me,’ *Earth and Soul* is a production the whole family will enjoy,” said Deborah Jung, founding and executive director of Kids Who Care.

Trout Fishing in America is the long-standing musical partnership of Keith Grimwood and Ezra Idlet. Three-time Grammy Nominees, this popular family entertainment duo creates “music for people who take their fun seriously.”

“We’re thrilled with the return of Trout Fishing in America to our home stage at the Scott Theatre,” said Jung. “Their fans are fun, energetic and span all the generations – the perfect match for us.”

The Kids Who Care Resident Company is an audition company of more than 80 children ranging in age from six to 19. The Resident Company performs locally, nationally and internationally each year, September through May. Past performance locations have included New York City, Los Angeles, Italy, Germany, Washington D.C., Orlando, Chicago and Nashville, as well as many regional venues.

This one-night performance, including Kids Who Care's *Earth and Soul* and a Trout Fishing in America concert, will run Friday, May 2, 2008 at 7:30pm at The Scott Theatre, 1300 Gendy St. in Fort Worth.
